



One Ambassador, One Million Dollars: Inside Rotary's Global Push to End Polio

Backgrounder — Yinka's Coco Challenge

Rotary International President Yinka Babalola and District 6330's Ambassador of Impact, Coco, are challenging fellow Rotarians and friends around the world to raise \$1 million (USD) to vaccinate 1 million children.

Meet Coco: A Small Ambassador on a Big Journey

Coco is the District 6330 Ambassador of Impact carrying the message alongside President Yinka at club visits, district events and international gatherings as a visual symbol of the campaign.

With Coco, we plan to raise a million US dollars to immunize a million children — imagine it, one million children who will never get crippled. That is **real lasting impact**, stated President Yinka.

A Global Mission, Nearly Finished

In the 1980s, polio paralyzed an estimated 1,000 children every single day. Rotary launched its PolioPlus program in 1985 and became a founding member of the Global Polio Eradication Initiative in 1988, alongside the World Health Organization, UNICEF, the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, Gavi, and later the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation.

The results have been dramatic: global polio cases are down 99.9% since 1988, and more than 3 billion children across 122 countries have been protected through vaccination. Wild poliovirus remains endemic in just two countries today, Afghanistan and Pakistan. But health officials caution that the job isn't done until it's done everywhere — a single undetected case can reignite outbreaks in places long considered polio-free.

How the Challenge Works

Yinka's Coco Challenge is structured to give everyone — from individual donors, Rotary Clubs, to major corporate partners — a way to participate:

- Individual donations of any size, made directly through Rotary's Raise for Rotary platform, with tax receipting.
- A four-tier corporate and major-donor sponsorship structure, from Mission Supporter (\$5,000+) to Eradication Partner (\$50,000+), each with its own campaign recognition.
- 100% of every dollar raised is directed to Rotary's PolioPlus program — and through Rotary's partnership with the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, every dollar given is multiplied: \$100 becomes \$300

The campaign runs until June 30, 2027.

Where it Began

At Rotary's Presidents-Elect Learning Seminar (PELS) in Kalamazoo, Michigan in March 2026, then District Governor Elect Lorna Gunning Fratschko presented Rotary International President Elect Yinka, the inaugural Coco. After a moment of consideration, Yinka asked Lorna if she would like a challenge. “How much will you give for every country that Coco and I visit together to support ending polio”, asked Yinka.

Team COCO, a volunteer committee of Rotarians was formed and now supports the campaign's website, marketing and global outreach to Rotary districts, clubs, and End Polio Now coordinators worldwide.

Your Role in the Yinka’s Coco Challenge

- **Sponsor** the campaign at the corporate or major-donor level, with recognition across the campaign's website, press materials, and events.
- **Pledge** an amount for every country Coco visits through the campaign's Pledge Wall.
- **Donate** online through the campaign website. Rotary members should give using their Rotary club/district email address, so the gift is properly credited to them, their club, and their district (PHF points, Major Donor credit, Sustaining Member status, etc.).
- **Share** the word about Yinka’s Coco Challenge with your club or district using the Digital Press Kit and activation toolkit, available on request.
- **Follow** the journey and track Coco and President Yinka's stops at the campaign website.
